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The Company: Body Politic

Body Politic is a flagship female led arts organisation, led by Artistic Director Emma-Jane Greig and founded in 2012.

Our vision is to transform the lives and experiences of young people through engaging with high quality Hip Hop Dance theatre.

Our work empowers young people from under-represented communities both, on and off the stage, through touring productions, creative learning and participation programmes, and digital learning and engagement opportunities.

The company's past show Father Figurine have toured to venues including The Place, Stephen Joseph Theatre and Stratford Circus, to critical acclaim.

Body Politic is artist in residence at Pegasus Theatre in Oxford, and is the leading dance company for provision of classes for young people aged 5-19 in Oxfordshire.

THEM is Body Politic's current touring production and is gratefully funded by Arts Council England to help deliver positive outcomes for young people.

THEM

Nina's boyfriend dumped her. He slept with her, then dumped her. She didn't say 'yes'. She was a bit drunk. She only remembers fragments. Now, the whole school knows....

THEM is a riveting Hip Hop Dance theatre show about consent, affirmation and the journey to finding your power through sisterhood and solidarity.

THEM follows the incredible journey of three young women who meet at a support group for survivors. Each one has a different story to tell, and as an unspoken bond of shared lived experience develops between them, they find courage to reflect, learn and accept their pasts, together. They move on.

A unique movement vocabulary conveys complex emotions, the stunning choreography flows seamlessly, from being powerfully gripping, to joyful and harmonious.

THEM is directed by Emma-Jane Greig, choreographed by Jackie Kibuka, and is set to a driving, electronic score by acclaimed composer C. Bickley.



Why This Work?



It is a stark reality to know that 1 in 4 women in the UK will experience sexual violence at some point in their lives. Roughly 85,0000 women a year*.



Basic Technical Requirements

Stage & Venue

THEM requires a 6.5m wide x 7.5m deep playing space, without a rake. Venues should provide black matt dance floor to cover the playing space. The dance floor should be laid prior to company arrival.

Flooring should be at least semi-sprung.

Please contact us as soon as possible if your floor is not sprung or you do not have a dance floor.

Lighting

Provided by the venue

Sidelight

3x 1.5m booms per side (total 6), with 2x boom arms per boom (total 12). 6x CP62 PAR64 (booms, with lenses at 1000mm)

Overhead

4x 25-50 deg profiles (LED preferable)

3x 1k fresnels

FOH cover featuring a separate centre cover

1x DMX controlled hazer, positioned USR

We tour our own colour for all units.

Toured lighting

3x Aryton Diablo moving lights (approx 22kg per fixture)

6x ETC 50 deg ColorSource Spots (shins, boom arm at 580mm)

Cabling for the above. CS Spots are on 16A tails, please advise if your venue does not have 16A hot power.

THEM requires an ETC Eos lighting desk provided by the venue.

A specific lighting plan for your venue will be sent nearer the time.

Technical requirements continued:

Sound

THEM uses a QLab Mac (toured) with a stereo output to run the audio playback for the show.

We require the use of a venue PA, and require full frequency coverage across the entire auditorium. The show contains a lot of sub-frequencies, so please contact us if your PA does not include subs.

Onstage monitoring / foldback is required at the downstage corners (mono). Where a pre- or post-show talk is scheduled, we request a minimum of 2x handheld radio mics from the venue. If radio mics are a chargeable item, we will use wired handhelds. No mic stands required.

Show Operation

The show is self-operated, with lighting cues triggered over OSC by our touring network between QLab and Eos. Lighting and sound must be able to be operated from the same location.

Communications

A comms system should be in place between the control position (FOH or in a booth) and backstage. The performers start off-stage and will be cued on by the ASM.

Set & Masking

The set consists of 6x black metal chairs.

We require a full black or black cyc on the upstage edge

We require leg masking rather than flat masking, with one leg downstage of each boom

Parking

We require 1x van parking space from the beginning of the get-in until the end of the get-out.

Marketing

THEM is very much aimed at young audiences and their families, as well as more general arts audiences. It is therefore important that venues ensure affordability for young people, as well as community groups that may be affected by the topic of the show. Our team are highly experienced at outreach and engagement and work with venues and a local Community Activist to ensure we can together access new audiences who would benefit from this opportunity.

We will take guidance from venues in regard to print as we are an environmentally conscious company and understand the need to cut down on unnecessary print.

Body Politic can provide the venue with publicity materials for the show: A5 flyers / A3 or A1 Posters

We are also committed to creating a dynamic and engaging social media campaign to accompany each performance. This can include live rehearsals insights, venue Instagram takeovers, and interviews with the cast. We are also open to creating a bespoke campaign with the venue to maximise audience engagement around the show.

Availability: From Spring 2023

Touring Company: Company consists of three dancers and one Relighter, a Production Manager and Assistant Stage Manager.

Running Time: 50mins (approximately)

Get-in: On the day with lighting pre-rigged in advance (to be discussed) Technical staff required by promoter: Two staff

- UK Touring fees: £1500 per performance, £2500 for two performances, runs to be discussed.
- Fee for curtain-raiser: £800 this represents 15 performers and a curtain raiser of 15mins.
- Full day workshop: £300 this represents up to 30 participants aged 14-19yrs.
